Dear Samuel Read Hall Resident;

Hello! Hopefully you are enjoying your summer, and this letter increases your excitement for the upcoming semester at PSU. I know that I am eager to meet you, and to spend the next year getting to know you.

Samuel Read Hall Hall (commonly referred to as “Hall” or “Hall Hall”) is generally home to a good mixture of upper-class and first year students—*welcome or welcome back!* I anticipate that this next year will be full of excitement for all of us living in Hall, and because a good many of you are new residents, here is some basic information about the building.

Hall Hall was built in 1921 and renovated in 2000. The hall has three floors (sorry, no elevator), which are coed by floor and by door. This fall, Hall will be home to approximately 111 residents (it is the smallest residence hall on campus). The staff in Hall consists of one professional staff member—the Residence Director—and four Community Advisors (these are student staff members and residents of Hall).

There are some great highlights to living in our building (besides the fact that it is a smaller community). Hall Hall is the only residence hall on campus to have three very nice kitchens—one on each floor. It also has two large lounges, public use computers, a pool table, a ping-pong table, and a small exercise room. An additional perk? We’re located right across the street from the campus library.

My name is Danielle, and as previously mentioned, I am the Residence Director for Hall Hall. I am a professional university employee (not a student), who lives in the residence hall all year round. I’m originally from Missouri, and this will be my fourth year as a residence director at PSU. I am here primarily as a resource and guide for you. I have other roles and responsibilities, which include supervising your community advisors, building a positive community, and maintaining the building; however, please do not hesitate to come visit, ask me questions, let me know of issues you are facing, etc. More than likely, I’ll be able to help you, or point you to someone who can.

Fall check-in is from 8:30am to 6pm on Sunday, August 31.
