

Finding Place on Paper: AESTHETIC SCANNING WORKSHEET

Choose one print and one poem in the exhibit.

The Print:

Describe it: What do you see?

• What **Elements of Art** do you notice?

(Lines, Shapes, Color, Value, Texture (actual or visual), Sense of space)

- What do you notice about the Subject matter?
- What Principles of Design are used?

(Balance, symmetry? Movement, Pattern/Rhythm/Repetition, Contrast, Emphasis, Unity/Harmony, Proportion/Scale)

 What Technical properties do you think are used? (Medium, materials, Process)

Interpret it: What do you think it's about?

- What "story" or meaning does the artwork convey to you?
- What feelings and/or ideas about the White Mountains are expressed?
- What do you like about the artwork?

The Poem:

Describe it: What do you notice?

How is it organized?

(stanzas, sentences, ideas grouped together in sections? Does it tell a story?)

What poetic devices are used?

(rhythm, rhyming, repetition, alliteration, assonance, unexpected capitalizations)

Make a list of key words: list 4 words that jump out at you as important in the poem
