

Pass the Paper and Print

Hands-on activity designed for Finding Place on Paper

Learning Objectives:

- To follow up and apply the experience of "place"
- To introduce simple printmaking tools and processes
- To have students experience a group art making process

Materials:

Simple printmaking tools such as stamps, sponges, stencils, foam blocks Various colors water based paint in pans/small containers Bravers

Time: 30 minutes

Process:

- Set up: long table, covered. Have a variety of stamps, stencils, brayers, paint, sponges, etc spread out. For each student have: 1 sharpie, one colored pencil, one large postcard size paper
- b. Explain that this exercise will have students responding on the postcard paper to prompts, then passing the work to the person on their right, who will add the next prompt response.. They will have only 5 seconds per prompt for the first few prompts- so no time for details!
- c. The prompts can change with the goals of the exercise- for this one, it's about laying the ground work for expressing the White Mountains as a place.
- d. Have students start with colored pencil, say "Mountain", then count down "5, 4, 3, 2 1, now pass the paper!"
- e. Follow with: "ground", "river", "tree", "rock", passing the paper each time
- f. Ask them to pick up sharpie, on the card they now have, add their first word they wrote down upstairs- somewhere on the picture. Pass the paper
- q. Ask them to write their second, then third word, passing the paper each time.
- h. Identify the various simple printmaking tools on the table. Ask students to experiment with 1 or 2 tools, printing onto the card to complete the work.
