










# NATIONAL WATER TRAILS SYSTEM




A distinctive national network of exemplary water trails which are designated by the Secretary of the Interior. The trails within the National Water Trails System are cooperatively supported and sustained.



#### Outdoor recreation is the third largest industry:

\$646 billion annual consumer spending)

The outdoor recreation economy grew 5% from 2005 to 2011

Paddlesports have increased significantly within the outdoor industry arena.

Water sports (motorized and non-motorized) contributed \$85 billion in spending, \$4.8 billion in local and state taxes, and created over 800,000 jobs.

The 140 million Americans who spent \$646 billion on outdoor recreation created \$80 billion per year in national, state, and local tax revenues

(The Outdoor Recreation Economy, 2012).




Figure 4.18. Distribution of total paddler spending across expenditure categories

### **Employment**

Paddlesports tourism has the potential to provide jobs and income while creating few public or environmental burdens. The Northern Forest Canoe Trail study states that the NFCT supported an estimated 283 jobs and provided \$4.1 million in personal income. Paddlesports tourism as a way to combat decreasing populations, increase services in rural areas, and provide employment opportunities.

NFCT showed that every \$1,000 in paddler spending leads to \$338 in personal income and .027 jobs.

Thus, the NFCT report estimates that an additional 85 non-local paddlers, spending roughly \$37,000 in local communities, will support the equivalent of one new job.

The Pennsylvania study estimated 11 full-time, year-round jobs were created from the water trail visitors. Approximately 70 to 75 percent of those jobs are direct results of trail expenditures.
