



## CCSNH- PSU Transfer Pathway Program: B.A. in English or English (Writing and Literature Option) DRAFT

**Plymouth State University** has partnered with the **Community College System of New Hampshire** to offer a Pathways Program that allows you to smoothly transition to PSU. This curriculum map shows you the courses to take while enrolled as a CCSNH student, for seamless transfer and efficient completion of the B.A. degree program in English or English (Writing and Literature Option). The pathway can be embedded in any CCSNH degree program but is particularly compatible with programs in English or liberal arts.

\* The CCSNH-PSU Block transfer agreement states that CCSNH students graduating with an associate's degree from any CCSNH campus, with an overall GPA of 2.0 will have fulfilled all general education requirements for Plymouth State University. A minimum of 60 credits will be transferred.

### At PSU you will complete the following requirements to earn your bachelor's degree:

Major Course Requirements
EN 3515- Currents in Global Literature
EN 3695- Critical Theory

At least **four** advanced level (3000 or 4000 level) electives; Students electing the Writing and Literature option must select from the approved list of Advanced Study in Writing electives

### General Education Program Course Requirements

Any general education requirements remaining and not covered by block transfer agreement\*

### University Degree Requirements

Language requirement\*\*

General elective courses to fill remaining credits required for the bachelor's degree (120 total)

\*Students must earn an associate's degree from CCSNH to be eligible for the block transfer program. Students transferring prior to associate's degree completion will be required to meet the requirements for the PSU general education program. CCSNH courses meeting specific PSU general education requirements will be evaluated at the time of transfer.

\*\* Foreign language requirement calls for 0-8 credits: one year of one language (6-8 credits) at the university level, or satisfactory completion of a departmental placement test and FR 2024 (French Language and Culture Studies), or SP 2024 (Spanish Language and Culture Studies), or satisfactory completion of one three-credit language course at the 3000-level or above, or satisfactory completion of a proficiency test (Advanced Placement or CLEP). ASL I & II will fulfill the language requirement

**NOTE THAT SPECIFIC PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE: AN ADVISOR AT PSU WILL PROVIDE YOU WITH THE BEST POSSIBLE GUIDANCE FOR COURSE SELECTIONS EACH TERM.**

**Also note:** Students may transfer a maximum of 90 credits in total. Students not transferring an associate's degree must receive a grade of C or better for courses to transfer. Note that some programs may have more stringent requirements for transfer.
