



## CCSNH- PSU Transfer Pathway Program: B.S. in History and Social Studies Education (Social Studies Education Option, Grades 5-12)

**Plymouth State University** has partnered with the **Community College System of New Hampshire** to offer a Pathways Program that allows you to smoothly transition to PSU. This curriculum map shows you the courses to take while enrolled as a CCSNH student, for seamless transfer and efficient completion of the B.S. degree program in History and Social Studies Education, with the Social Studies Teaching Option for Grades 5-12. The pathway can be embedded in any CCSNH degree program but is particularly compatible with programs in liberal arts or social sciences.

\*Students must earn an associate's degree from CCSNH to be eligible for the block transfer program. Students transferring prior to associate's degree completion will be required to meet the requirements for the PSU general education program. CCSNH courses meeting specific PSU general education requirements will be evaluated at the time of transfer.

### Also note:

Students may transfer a maximum of 90 credits in total. Students not transferring an associate's degree must receive a grade of C or better for courses to transfer. Note that some programs may have more stringent requirements for transfer.
